#### A Message from the Director


Welcome to Main Street Players' Christmas production of *The 1940's Radio Hour.* 

This show has a particular appeal to me because my parents were both veterans of World War II. Mother was a 1st Lieutenant in the Army Nurse Corps and Dad was a Captain in the U.S. Army Infantry. He fought in the Battle of the Bulge and was badly wounded trying to save another soldier. He was awarded a Purple Heart and a Silver Star. Mom was his nurse while he was recovering. She discovered that he yearned for some hotdogs, which were a rare commodity at this time. Apparently she had to bribe a cook to scavenge up a couple. When she brought them into Dad, he was involved in a game of cards. He sort of grunted at her and ordered her, "to put them over there." Feeling that her efforts were under appreciated, she promptly picked up one of the coveted "dogs" and threw it at him. He quipped to his buddy, "That woman has got some fire in her." The rest is history.

I have never understood why people thought this was a "simpler time." If anything it was as complex and uncertain as today. The difference was how that generation chose to deal with their problems. They didn't whine or tell the whole world their business. There was an unspoken dignity and acceptance of the situation. They didn't give in...they just got on with it. Entitlement and self-indulgence were not words with which they were very familiar. Honor and determination and perseverance were more their style. Maybe that's what earned them the title of the "Greatest Generation." They certainly were in my eyes.

Thank you to all of our dedicated volunteers, our Board of Directors for their countless hours of working at the theatre, to BJ and his spectacular set, to the other creative team members who have helped instruct, design, corral actors, and beg items for this production. Most of all, thank you, dear patrons, who have supported us and given so generously over the years. You are our reason for being. May the spirit that surrounds and fills us during this Christmas season remain with us throughout the New Year! Now enjoy the show.
