GARY ALEXANDER (Harry Haywood and John Housman) is a familiar face to MSP patrons. Previous roles include Clifton Feddington in 1940's Radio Hour, Heck Tate in To Kill A Mockingbird, Charlie in On Golden Pond, the stage manager in It's A Wonderful Life, Sir Lawrence Wargrave in Ten Little Indians or Then There Were None, and as Third Officer Pitman and the Major in Titanic, the Musical. Gary has appeared in multiple roles with GBT. When he is not on stage, he enjoys providing medical care to the good folks of Griffin-Spalding. Gary is the proud father of two children, Georganna and Will, and spouse to Cindi.

CURTIS BROWN (Jake Laurents and Mr. Stewart) was very busy with MSP last year. He appeared at MSP as Judge Mel Coffey in *Inherit the Wind*, multiple roles in *Charlotte's Web*, Neil Tilden in *1940s Radio Hour*, the Centipede in *James and the Giant Peach* and Norman Bulansky in *The Boys Next Door*. He also managed to squeeze in a performance with Studio D as Eddie in their production of *Rocky Horror*. He has worked with Main Street in some capacity almost every season since 2002. Other favorite roles include Selznick in *Moonlight & Magnolias*, Amos in *Chicago with the Henry Players* and the Thurston rotation in *The Tuna* series, which toured the Southeast.

CLARK DOUGLAS (Freddie Filmore and Orson Wells) was seen last season as Man 2 in 39 Steps, Johnny Cantone in 1940's Radio Hour and E.K. Hornbeck in Inherit the Wind. Other MSP roles include Oscar Madison in The Odd Couple, Victor Fleming in Moonlight and Magnolias, multiple roles in Greater Tuna (something he has also done in other Main Street productions like The Dining Room, Every Christmas Story Ever Told (And Then Some!) and It's a Wonderful Life: A Live Radio Play), Thomas Andrews in Titanic The Musical, Mitch in Tuesdays with Morrie and William Blore in Ten Little Indians. He has also done work with The Henry Players, playing The Creature in Frankenstein: A New Musical, Lawrence Jameson in Dirty Rotten Scoundrels and Lt. Jonathan Kendrick in A Few Good Men. Offstage, Clark is the station manager at WHIE Radio and lives in Griffin with his wife Rebekah,

their 3-year-old son Oliver and two cats. He is greatly appreciative of the opportunity to work with a wonderful group of collaborators on this show.

CHRIS GANSEL (Dan Seymour) Chris is thrilled to be making his Main Street Players' debut! He is a veteran of many productions of The Henry Players, and was last seen there as Edward Bloom in *Big Fish*. Chris is a two-time MAT award nominee for his work in *Next to Normal* and *Of Mice and Men*. He would like to thank Norma, Marian and the rest of the Main Street family for making him feel like one of their own, and dedicates his performance to his lovely (and oh so patient) wife, Beth.

BJ HUGHES (Scenic Designer) is beginning his seventh season as resident scenic designer for Main Street Players. Favorite shows he designed include Inherit the Wind, The 1940's Radio Hour, Crimes of the Heart, A Trip to Bountiful, Titanic, the Musical, and Cotton Patch Gospel. In addition he has directed and designed 39 Steps, The Boys Next Door, The Odd Couple, Crimes of the Heart, A Trip to Bountiful, Deathtrap, Ten Little Indians, On Golden Pond, and The Little Foxes. NORMA RICHARDSON (Director) is opening her 17th season at MSP. Her theatre experience includes: acting, directing, writing and production management. She has been involved with theatre for most of her life and has appeared on a number of Atlanta stages among others. With Main Street, her credits include: *Inherit the Wind, Nunset Blvd., Titanic-The Musical, Tuesday's With Morrie, Every Christmas Story Ever Told (and Then Some), Mama Won't Fly, Our Town,* and on stage productions include; *Southern Comforts, Driving Miss Daisy, The Little Foxes, The Guys, Steel Magnolias, Driving Miss Daisy, Grace & Glorie,* and *Same Time Next Year*. Floyd has appeared as Larry (the custodian) in *School House Rock*, Reverent Doctor Harper and Superintendent Witherspoon in *Arsenic and Old Lace* and as Grandpa in *Meet Me in Saint Louis* with Camelot Theatre. For Henry Players he was Mitchell in *Yes Virginia*, *There Is A Santa Claus* and Judge Randolph in *A Few Good Men*. He has also appeared as Doctor Agnagnus in *The Miracle Worker* with Front Porch Players. Floyd is a native of Griffin and has been married to Linda for the last 52 years and has six grandchildren.

ELISE WRIGHT (Lana Sherwood and Ora Nichols) has appeared in the Main Street Players' productions of *The 39 Steps* (as the understudy for Annabella, Margaret, and Pamela) and *The 1940's Radio Hour* (as Connie Miller).
